Step3 Careful reading—the origins of queuing (para2)

Like it or not, queuing is necessary to keep order and stop people from getting angry at each other. But where does it come from? According to the website, Culture Trip, the origins of queuing go back to the early 19th century at the beginning of the Industrial Revolution (工业革命) in England. Why? As cities were getting bigger and more crowded, queues naturally formed for everyday things like posting letters and buying items in local shops.
